



Reilly Foam Moves to Lower Providence Township *Manufacturer Brings 85 jobs to Park Pointe at Lower Providence*

LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP (October 24, 2011) – From its start 39 years ago in its founder’s garage in Roxborough, Reilly Foam Corporation has grown into an industry leader, with facilities in Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Florida and Illinois. Now the corporation hopes to continue its success in Lower Providence Township.

In September, Reilly Foam relocated its Conshohocken operations and national headquarters to a 140,000 sq. ft. facility at 2525 Monroe Boulevard in the Park Pointe at Lower Providence business park. The move brings 85 employees to the Township.

At the October 20th Board of Supervisors meeting, Reilly Foam was officially welcomed to the Township. On hand for the recognition were Charles Reilly, founder and CEO, and Stephen Phillips, company president.

Reilly shared the history of his company with the Board members and said that the firm is fortunate to have many long-time employees, noting that some have been with him for over 30 years. He explained that the company supplies engineered foam for a wide range of consumer and industrial applications, including cosmetics, cleaning supplies, the aerospace industry, and military packaging. The company is one of only six fabricators nationwide to garner the “A” level fabricator status.

“We’re absolutely delighted to be part of the Township,” Reilly said, adding that he is anxious to complete the move to the new facility.
