### **U.S. 422 Overnight Lane Closures Scheduled at Route 363 (Trooper Road) Interchange in Montgomery County**

**King of Prussia** – Overnight travel on U.S. Route 422 will be reduced to one lane in each direction approaching the Route 363 (Trooper Road) Interchange in West Norriton and Lower Providence townships, Montgomery County, on Wednesday through Friday (Sept. 17-19) for overhead bridge construction, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation today announced.

The bridge work is part of PennDOT's \$16.8 million project to improve travel through the Route 422-Route 363 (Trooper Road) Interchange by constructing two additional access ramps and widening Route 363 (Trooper Road).

Eastbound and westbound Route 422 will be reduced from two lanes to one at Route 363 (Trooper Road) on these three nights from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning while crews perform preparatory work in advance of painting steel beams on the Route 363 (Trooper Road) bridge over Route 422.

Motorists are advised to allow additional time for travel on Route 422 through the work area because slowdowns may occur.

PennDOT began construction in October 2013 to build an on-ramp from Route 363 (Trooper Road) to westbound Route 422 and an off-ramp from eastbound Route 422 to Route 363 (Trooper Road), and to widen Route 363 (Trooper Road). Construction is scheduled to finish in fall 2015.

J.D. Eckman, Inc. of Atglen, Chester County, is the general contractor on the \$16,857,533 contract, which is financed with 100 percent federal funds.
