LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP – The Lower Providence Township Board of Supervisors took the following actions at the May 7th business meeting:

Approvals

- Approved the consent agenda including:
 - Minutes of the April 16, 2020 meeting of the Board of Supervisors
 - Escrow release: Iroy Sports & Fitness #2 in the amount of \$107,398.00
- Approved Addendum 2 from McMahon Associates for the Park Avenue/Eagleville Road/Crawford Road intersection improvement project. The project, representing a unique intergovernmental/private-public partnership, will realign and improve the safety of the heavily travelled intersection. McMahon Associates was appointed by the Township to complete the design, which is currently in the final phase with completion projected for May 2021. The construction phase is not expected until spring of 2022 or later and is expected to take two construction seasons to complete. Ordinances

- Approved the advertisement of an ordinance establishing the office of Fire Marshal/Emergency Management Coordinator
- Adopted Ordinance No. 668, approving a guaranty agreement for a loan for the Lower Providence Sewer Authority. The \$10 million loan will be used by the Sewer Authority to address the aging sewer system, specifically critical areas where inflow and infiltration (I/I) has been identified. Inflow is clear water that enters the sewer system from a variety of sources and infiltration occurs when groundwater seeps into sewer pipes through cracks, leaky pipe joints and/or deteriorated manholes which may cause sewage volumes to exceed design capacity.

Announcements

- The Parks and Recreation Open Space Committee received six bids for the Request for Proposal for the Open Space Plan. The committee is evaluating the submissions and anticipates having a recommendation for the Board's May 21 meeting.
