LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP – The Lower Providence Township Board of Supervisors took the following actions at the May 21st business meeting:

Approvals

- Approved the consent agenda including:
 - Minutes of the May 7, 2020 meeting of the Board of Supervisors
 - Payment of bills in the amount of \$634,442.34
- Awarded the contract for the 2020 road improvements project to the low bidder, Alan Myers Construction, in the amount of \$416,077.00. Roads to be paved in the 2020 project are: Parklane Drive, Driftwood Drive, Lee Road, Fox Road, Landis Mill Road, Oakdale Avenue, Oaklyn Avenue, W. Sunset Avenue, S. Midland Road, Coppermine Road, Leon Avenue, and Kingston Circle.
- Accepted the recommendation of the Open Space Committee to select Simone Collins Landscape Architecture to complete the Parks & Recreation Open Space Plan. The work is being funded by a Community Partnership grant from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR). The selection will be forwarded to DCNR for review and approval.
