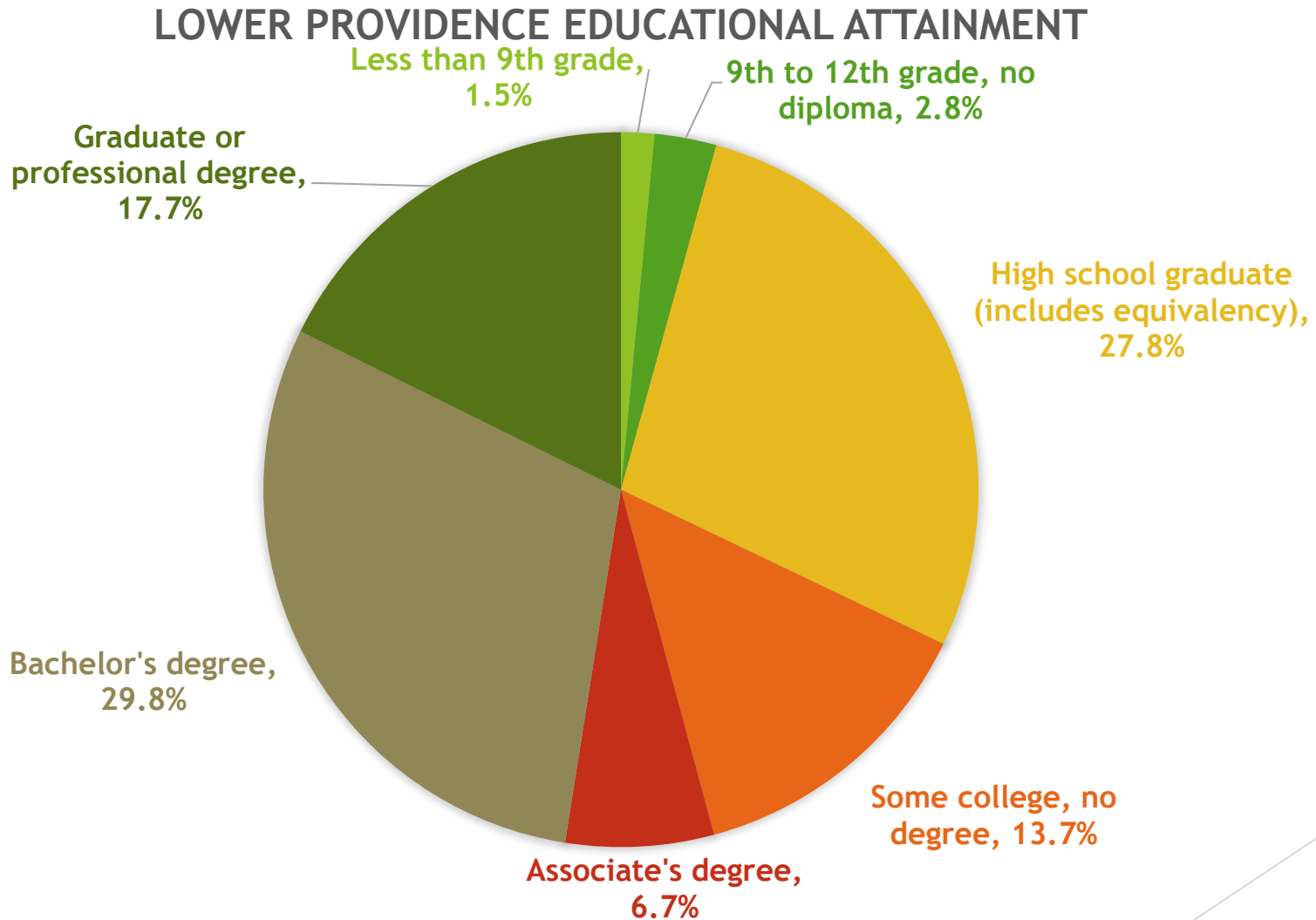

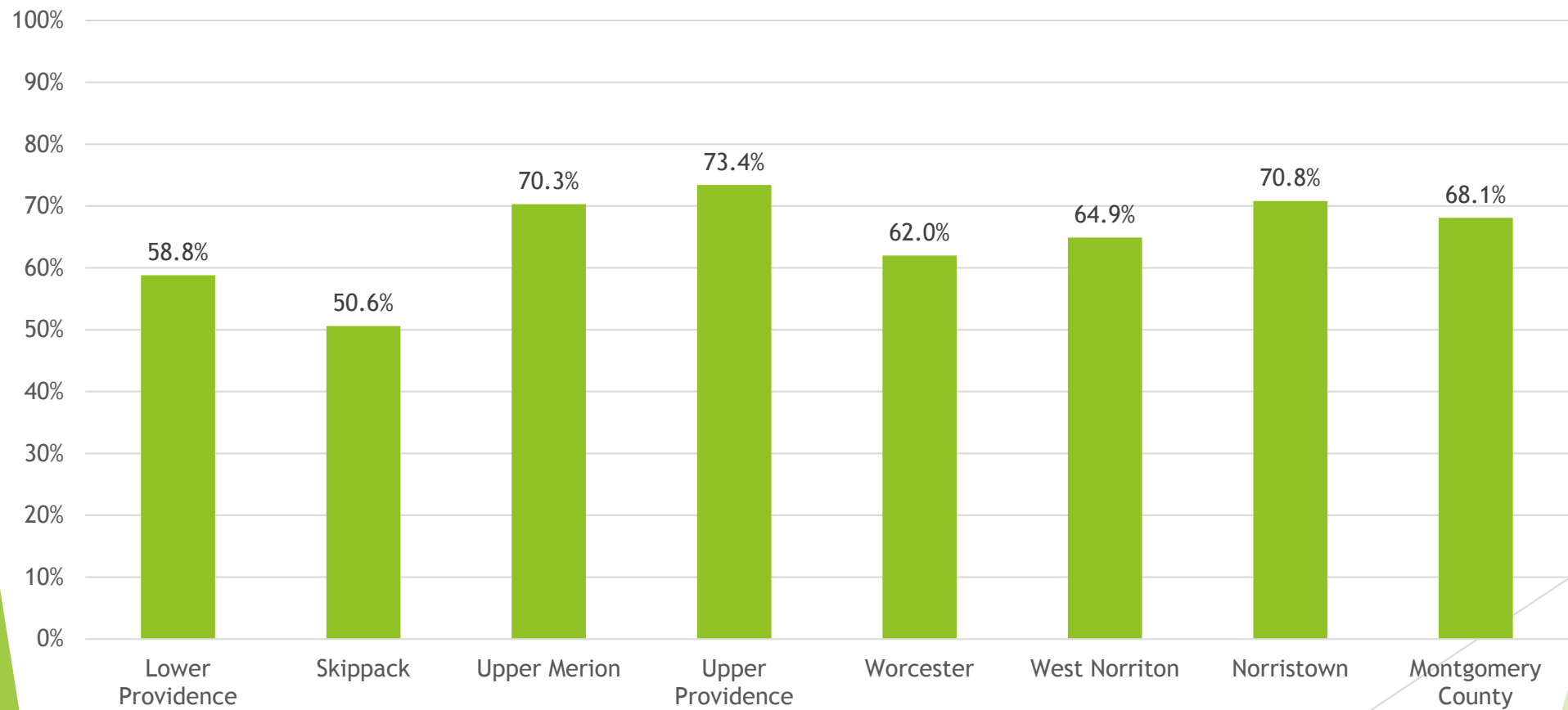

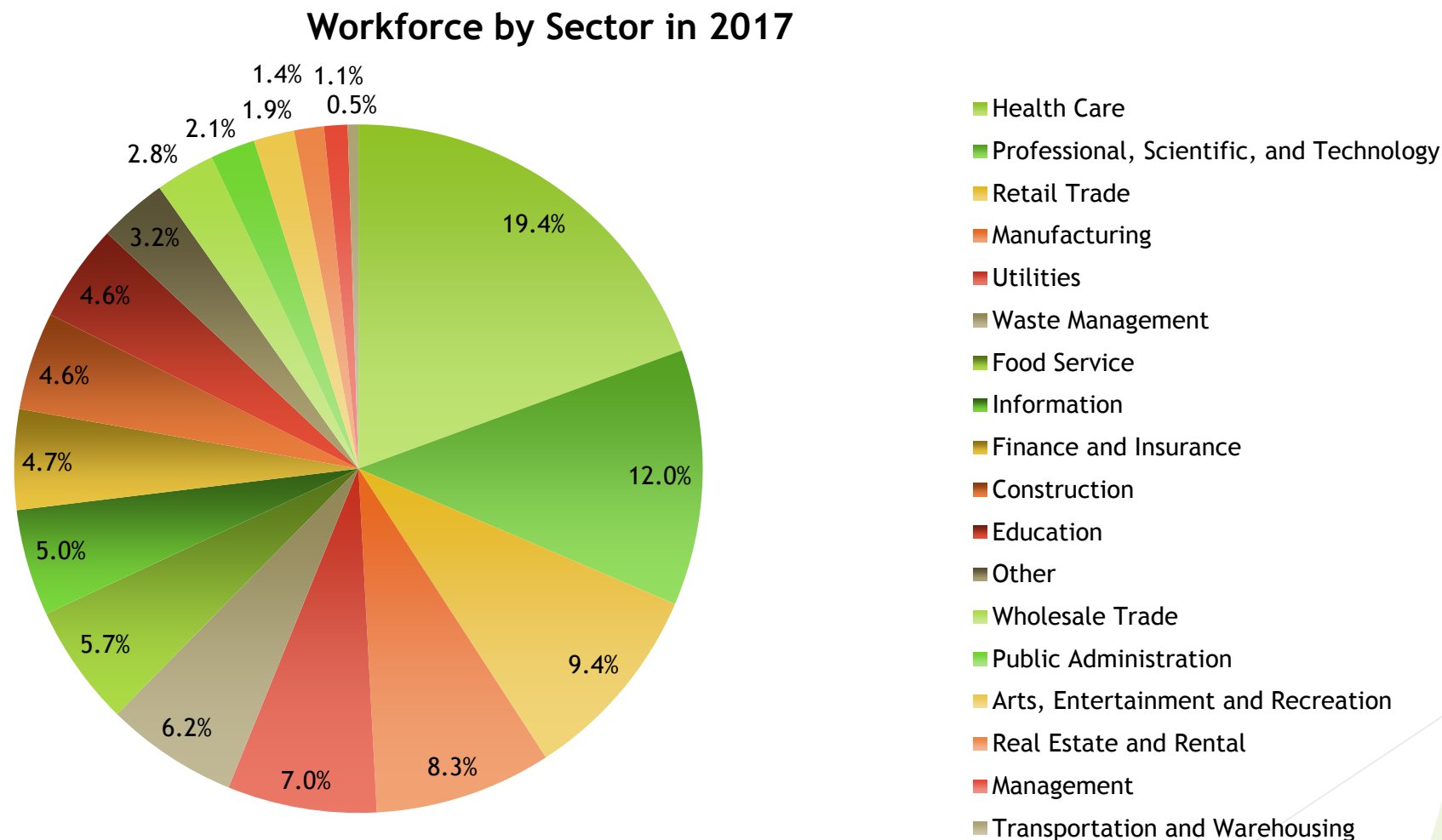


Labor Force Participation Rate (age 16 and over):

Employment by Sector

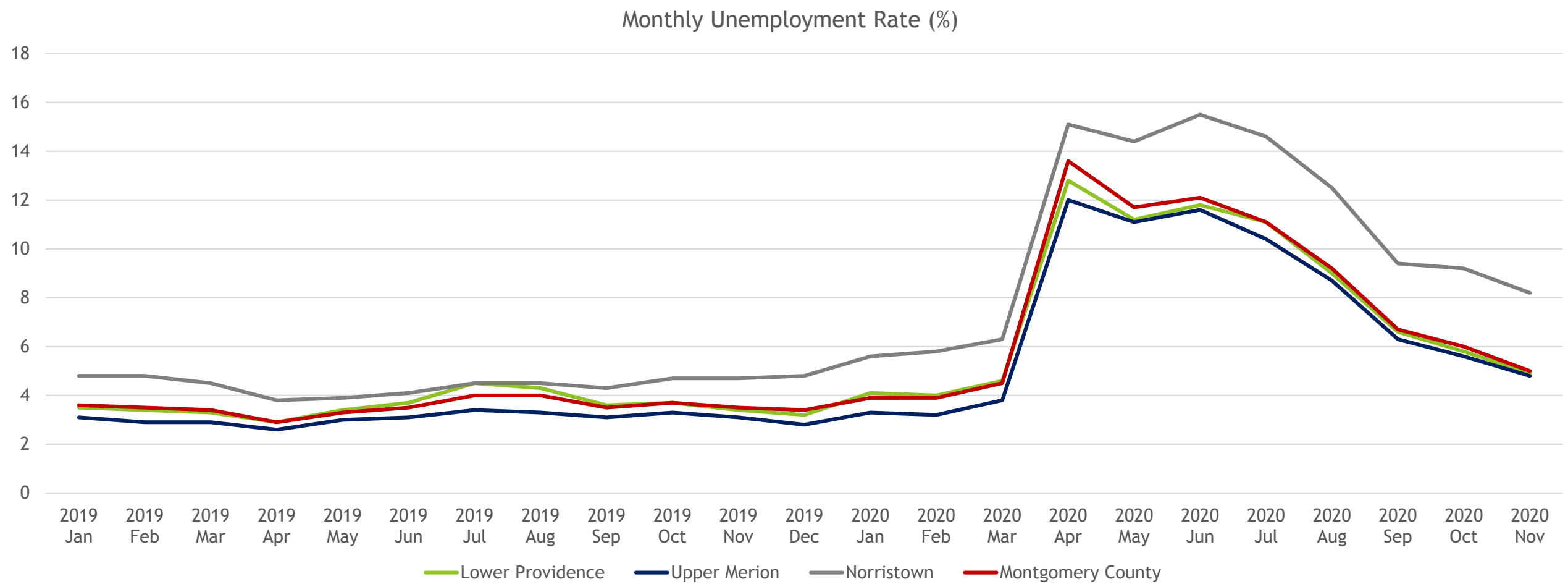

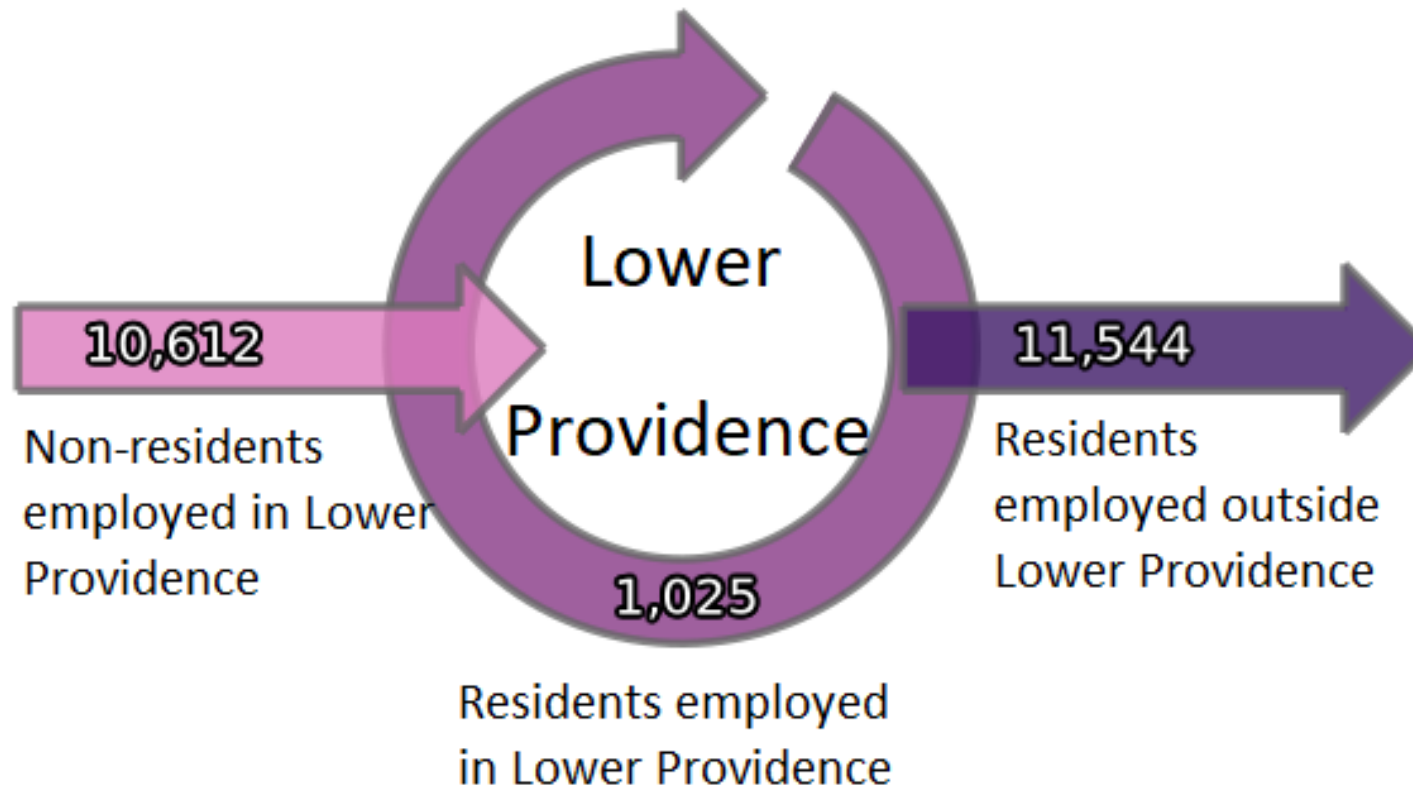

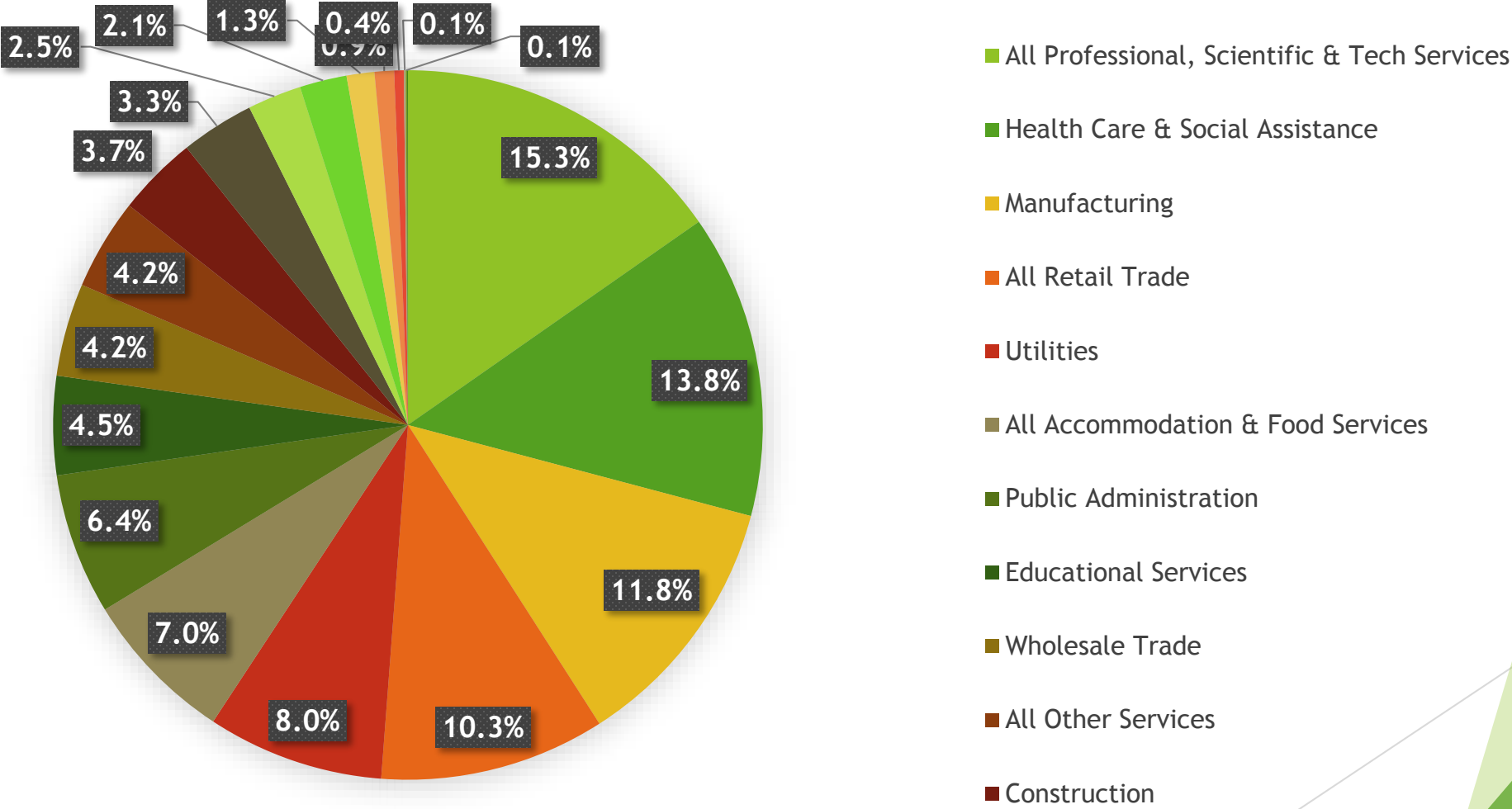

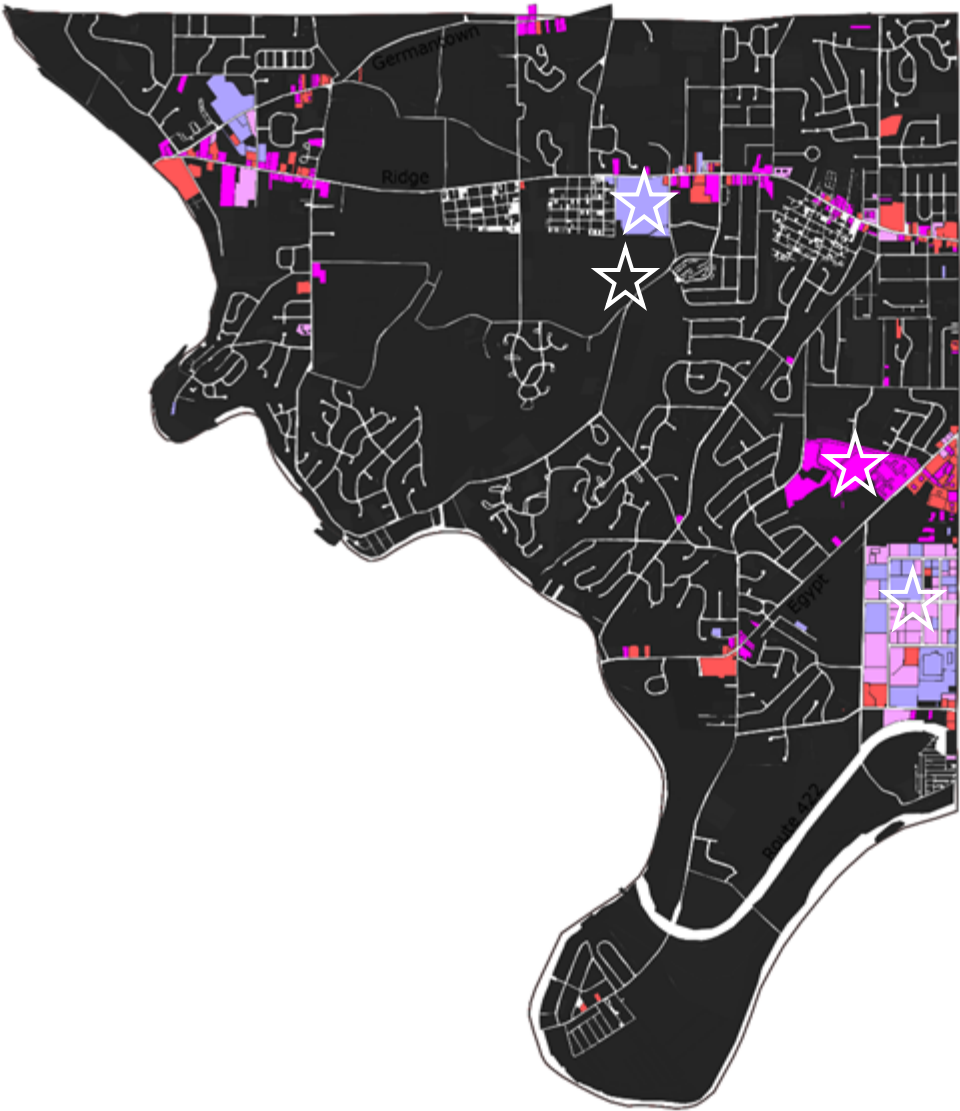

Commercial and Industrial Acreage

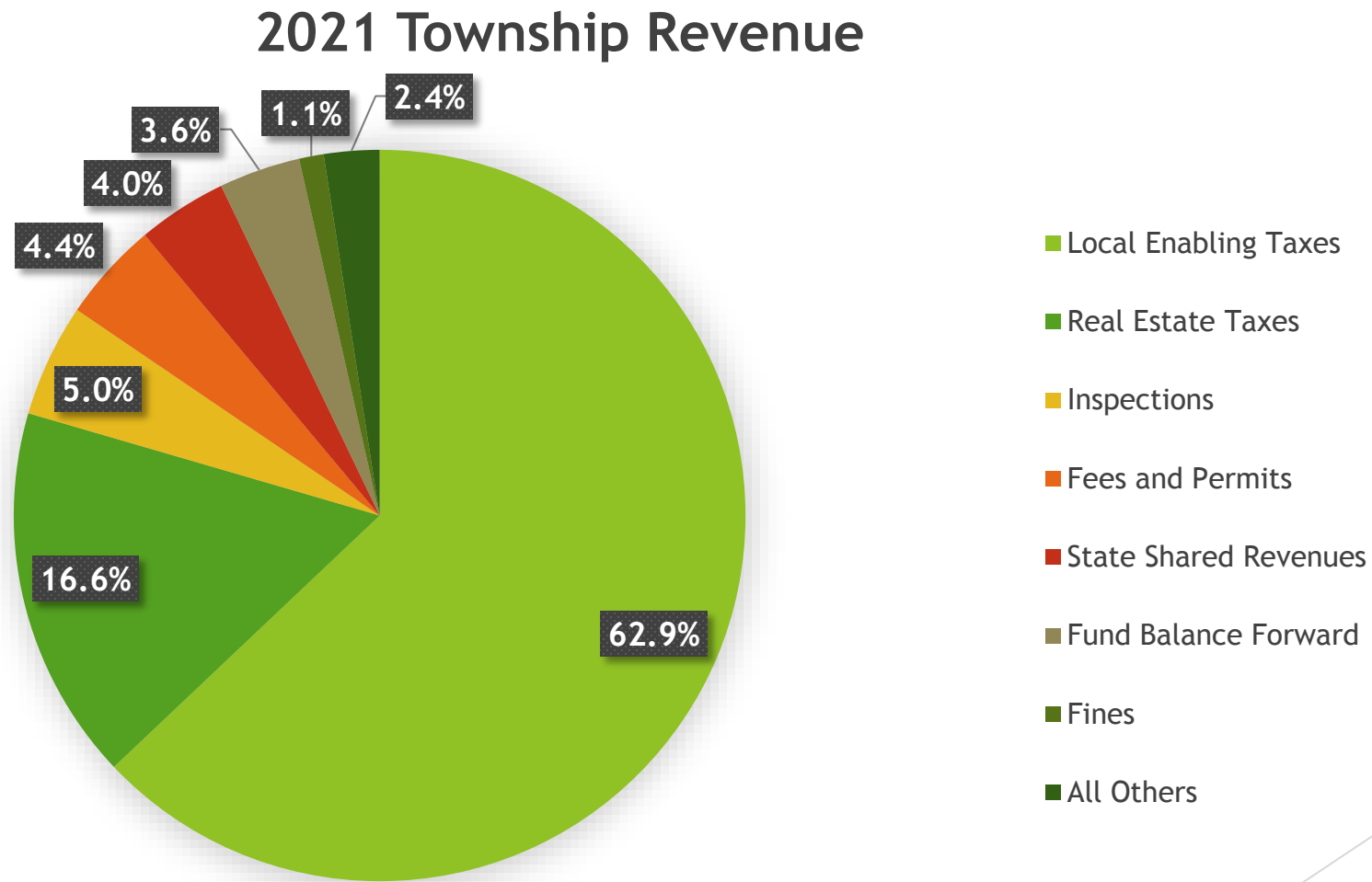

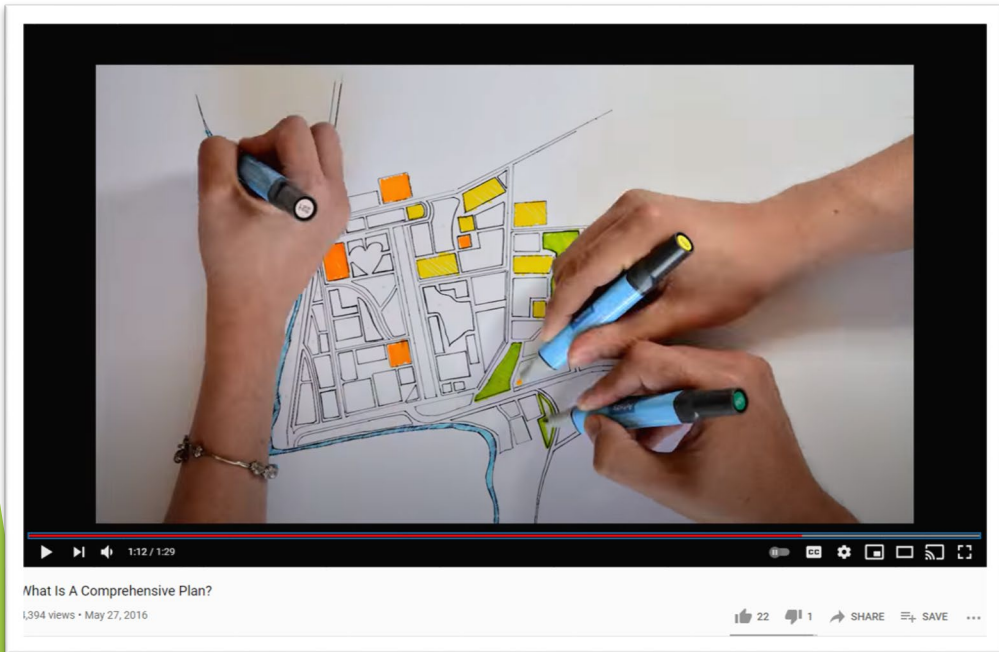
