



MontCo Highlights


73 Projects Totaling \$965 million over 12 years

9 total projects added since FY2019 TIP Most are maintenance or grant projects


2 major projects added since FY2017 TIP: Belmont Avenue Bridge over Schuylkill River and Philmont/Tomlinson/Pine intersection
















Figure 1. The fatality rate of pedestrians in crashes with passenger cars as function of the collision speed (from Rosén et al., 2011).

The policy can serve as a framework for local complete street policies to follow


What is a Complete Street?


- Sidewalks
