- 2. If you need assistance with clean-up, call the Hurricane Ida Crisis Cleanup Hotline at (844) 965-1386.
 - Assistance provided
 - Cutting fallen trees
 - Removing affected drywall, flooring, and appliances
 - Tarping roofs
 - Mitigating mold
 - These services are performed by volunteers and will be provided at no cost to the resident.
 - Service is not guaranteed, however, as resources are limited.
- 3. If you need assistance with a place to stay, the American Red Cross has opened a shelter at the Norristown High School, located at <u>1900 Eagle Drive, Norristown, PA 19403</u>.
 - This is a pet friendly shelter
 - If possible, pet owners should bring food, a crate, a sheet or blanket, and a bowl. These items will be supplied if a pet owner is unable to provide them.
- 4. <u>Montgomery County Mobile Crisis</u> provides support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at **1-855-634-HOPE (4673)**. This service is available to anyone in Montgomery County, including children, teens, adults, and families.
