- Plan for safe multi-modal connections between various Township park, recreation, and open space resources





Public Survey Results


Top 5 priorities that Lower Providence should focus on:

- 1. Open Space and Natural Resources Preservation: 42%
- 2. Pedestrian Connections: 40%
- 3. Trails: *31%*
- 4. Bike Lanes: 28%
- 5. Improvements to Existing Facilities: 22%

- 91% live in Lower Providence
- 42% of those in Lower Providence have lived in the Township for 21+ years
- 53% of all respondents are between the ages of 45-64
- Most respondent households have 2 members
- 94% of these households had members who participated in recreation in parks, natural areas, or open spaces in/around Lower Providence in the last year
- 91% walk, run or bike on area trails or roadways
- 92% of respondents drive to area parks; 81% feel that there are an adequate number of parks, natural areas and trails available to them or in close proximity to where they live

Facilities Improvements – Eagleville Park

- Conceptual Improvements
 - A Improve ADA path to bocce courts
 - B Pave and formalize parking area.
 - Field Option A: Aerate & seed; Field Option B: Make turf field, stormwater BMP
 - Improve parking entry and wayfinding signage.





Facilities Improvements – Eagleville Park


- Conceptual Improvements
 - Make restroom entrance ADA accessible.
 - Expand swing safety surface area.
 - **G** New Amphitheater in upper lawn.
 - Provide ADA picnic tables, repurpose shuffleboard court for horseshoes or other activity.
 - Make pathway ADA accessible.
 - Convert amphitheater stage to pavilion.

 Move amphitheater to area G.



Facilities Improvements – Eskie Park

- Conceptual Improvements
 - Expand swing safety surface area. Add bucket seat swing.
 - B Plant shade trees.
 - Re-grade for multi-use field.
 - Add ADA benches in pavilion. Expand playground safety surface area.
 - **E** BMP plantings near impervious surfaces at public works.
 - F Plant additional shade trees, install benches
 - G Additional parking 25 spaces.
 - Multi-use perimeter trail (.65 miles)
 - Potential parcel for open space acquisition.





Facilities Improvements – MARA Fields

- Conceptual Improvements (Have to be approved by the County)
 - Add shade trees to parking area.
 - B Naturalize & Improve Stormwater Basin
 - Thin tree buffer for security visibility.
 - Add pavilion for spectators, close path to vehicles.
 - ADA walking path to connect parking areas and ballfields (stone dust or asphalt).
 - Expand safety surface area for swing set.
 - **G** Expand safety surface area for playground.
 - Plant native grasses along swale.
 - Plant shade trees along Audubon Road.
 - Sidewalk connection along Audubon Road.
 - Pedestrian intersection crossing improvements: ADA curb cuts, detectable warning surfaces.
 - Additional 30 car parking area





Facilities Improvements – Evansburg Point Park

- Conceptual Improvements (Have to be approved by DCNR)
 - A Connection to Level Road.
 - B Plant shade Trees.
 - C Upgrade snack shack facility.
 - Provide ADA picnic pavilion access & ADA picnic tables.
 - Install turf field.
 - F Plant shade trees.
 - G Reduce mown area, plant area with native grasses / wildflowers.
 - H Develop stormwater basin.






Facilities Improvements – Redtail Park **Conceptual Improvements** Sidewalk connection to existing Eagleville Rd. Sidewalk; ADA connection to parking area. Soccer Field Shade trees. Baseball Perimeter trail (asphalt, stone dust) Field Amend soil, plant shade trees. Improve existing stormwater basin to meet modern MS-4 standards. Restroom facility. **Existing Conditions Legend** Parcel Line Sidewalk Topography (1' Contour)

Adopt Official Map

 An official map is an effective negotiation tool for municipalities, helping to ensure long-term preservation of open space.

An Official map can include but is not limited to:

- Existing and proposed public parks, playgrounds and open space reservations
- Existing and proposed off-road trail alignments
- Flood control areas, floodways and floodplains, stormwater management areas and drainage easements.



Potential Open Space & Rec Acquisition

Option A: Develop for active recreation facilities.

Option B: Preserve Agriculture Fields

- Lower Providence Township has minimal preserved agricultural lands, in this option LP can purchase and permanently preserve this agriculture area
- Lower Providence should consider working with Worcester Twp. In a coordinated effort to acquire open space.





Potential Open Space & Rec Acquisition

- Owner: J. Heyser (identified in 2002/2005 OS&R Plan; BooBoo Realty
- Size: 36 Acres; 17.5 Acres
- Characteristics: Wooded / dense vegetation

Potential Open Space & Rec Acquisition


- Owner: St. Gabriels Property
 (Philadelphia Protectory For Boys) –
 identified in 2002/2005 OS&R Plan
- Size: 46.5 Acres
- Potentially use St. Gabriels land (<u>not</u> <u>building</u>) to connect Audubon Center to Valley Forge & protect landscape
- Acquisition can connect ballfields and underutilized portion of Valley Forge Park
- Local, County, & Federal Project
- Could be potential application for future official map – designate fields as open space



Place on Official Map

Parcels Identified in 2002 Open Space Plan & 2005 Open Space Plan Update

- Arcola Road Camp Hideaway. Lower Providence Rod and Gun Club.
- Pechins Mill Road Area / IBEW **Property**







- The primary purpose to designate a "Greenway":
 - Foster the preservation and protection of critical habitats
 - Protect and enhance the water quality
 - Greenways may or may not contain a trail or allow access
- Additional Greenways should be considered along hydrologic resources and extend from existing Townshipowned parcels.
- In Lower Providence Township they are protected under ARTICLE XXXIV (Riparian Buffer Overlay Zone) This ordinance regulates land use to ensure natural resources are preserved and protected.






• Existing Greenways & Waterways

Successful greenway expansion & improved water quality will require action by local government and private citizens.

The Township has done a great job of acquiring key greenway parcels, and will need the help of private citizens, as the Township is largely built-out.

- Create program for revegetation of greenway cover gaps
- Consider retroactive application of greenway buffer ordinance as a means to better address MS-4 mandate

Local Government


- Set vision

Property Owners & Private Citizens


- Reduce large lawn areas, replace with meadows & grasses

- Plant native / diverse tree species




Existing Sidewalks & Gaps

Maintenance & Programming

Recreation Programming Opportunities

- Improve offerings by providing year-round activities
 - Community has noted desire for additional programming
- Indoor facilities are needed for an enhanced programming schedule
 - Current facilities do not permit for increased programs
- Create or increase partnerships (schools, county, private facilities, M.O.U.'s)
 - Schools are used in the summer; expand to include year-round through new partnerships
- Programs are well received, but we need to "climb the ladder" and register for more activities
 - Currently, there are limited spaces for fall, winter and spring locations to offer programs



Maintenance & Programming

Financial Structure

- Additional revenues will be realized if/when additional programs are introduced
- Program fees are well thought out and a sound practice is in place for fee determination
- New programs may take a year or two to become profitable
- Parks & Recreation Board should review resident rate vs. non-resident rate

Maintenance Practices

 Opportunities exist for increased park amenities

Risk Management

- Consumer Product Safety
 Commission guidelines
- ADA compliance
- DVIT performs annual park review

Administrative Actions

- Administration is run very well
- Consider 2 seasonal maintenance employees who report directly to Parks & Rec Director
