Lower Providence Township Parks & Recreation Department Earns State Awards for Programming

LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP (*April 23, 2013*) – The Lower Providence Township Parks & Recreation Department received two top programming honors at the 2013 Pennsylvania Recreation & Parks Society state conference last month.

The Department earned "Excellence in Programming" awards for its entries in the following categories:

- *Maintenance Program or Technique* The Township earned the honor for its invasive plant removal and tree planting at Hoy Park. The project was completed in partnership with the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy and with a TreeVitalize Grant.
- Special Event (attendance over 2,500) The 25th Annual Community Fall Festival was recognized by the Society.
