CALL TO ORDER

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM and led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Chairman stated that there was an Executive Session prior to the meeting to discuss legal issues.

MINUTES

The minutes of the November 8, 2017 meeting were presented. Upon motion of Mr. Tschoepe, seconded by Mr. Stanczak and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes was waived and approved. The vote was 3-0 with Mr. Rose abstaining from voting as he was not at that meeting.

STATEMENTS OF OPERATION

Mr. Stanczak presented the October and November Statements of Operation to the Board for approval.

Upon motion of Mr. Tschoepe, seconded by Mr. Rose and unanimously carried, the Board approved the October and November Statements of Operation presented.

Engagement Letter

Mr. Stanczak presented to the Board the Engagement Letter from Reynolds, Pittner, LLC for the Fiscal Year 2018 Audit. A motion was made by Mr. Stanczak, seconded by Mr. Tschoepe and unanimously carried to accept the Engagement Letter from Reynolds, Pittner, LLC per the amount stipulated.

PERSONNEL

Maintenance Employee

Mr. Tschoepe reported to the Board that Michael Hagenbuch has accepted the position of the Sewer Maintenance Employee and will start on January 2, 2018.

End of Year Adjustment

A motion was made by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. Tschoepe and unanimously carried to approve the eight EDUs requested for the John James Audubon Center located at 1201 Pawlings Road and one EDU for 3833 Landis Mill Road.

PA Small Water and Sewer Grant Program

Mr. Woyden stated that the PA Department of Community and Economic Development has a funding opportunity available for PA small water and sewer program which he investigated.

Sanitary Sewer Replacement

Mr. Woyden stated that the Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project is progressing. Approximately 8,985 LF of main, 5,165 LF of 6 inch and 4 inch pipe and 35 manholes have been replaced as of Estimate #4 which Mr. Woyden requested a motion for payment.

A motion was made by Mr. Rose, seconded by Mr. Stanczak and unanimously carried, to authorize the Chairman to sign Payment Estimate #4 which includes change order number one for the Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project with PACT One, LLC.

SYSTEM SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT DECEMBER 2017

FOR WORK DONE NOVEMBER 1, 2017 - NOVEMBER 30, 2017

SEWER AUTHORITY PROJECTS

Pact One has started the Walker Lane phase of the Sewer Replacement Project. On the first day of work on Walker Lane they dug up manhole number W11 at intersection of Mt. Kirk which was 20 foot deep and the force main that runs next to the gravity main started filling the ditch with sewer due to a leak that was there prior to the start of the work. The dirt surrounding the manhole was black and saturated indicating that it was leaking for some time. The gravity main also had a major break right outside of the manhole which means that some of the sewer that was leaking out of the force main was leaking back into the broken gravity main and returning back to the pump station to be pumped out again. This repair should make a major difference at the station. Pact One has completed replacing all of the 8 inch gravity main on Walker Lane as of Wednesday 12/6/2017 and then started replacing laterals. They should be moving to Kenny Lane to start work on Monday12/11/2017.

Dynatech Generator Company has performed the maintenance on all of the generators and bypass pumps as per contract.

The Crane truck was delivered and the decals for the doors were ordered and will be put on soon.

DEVELOPER PROJECTS:

Providence Place and Brynwood Manors both broke ground and will be installing sewer systems soon.

Audubon Bird Sanctuary has scheduled with us to tie their sewer lateral into the manhole on Audubon and Pawlings Road within the next couple weeks.

MISCELLANEOUS PROJECTS:

We narrowed the job applicants down to two and held a second interview and decided upon one. We are in the process of putting an offer together and will send it to him and wait for a response.

MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT:

In addition to the daily inspection and maintenance of the pumping stations, the Maintenance Department:

- o Responded to 141 locations (PA One Calls).
- o Installed new heater in electrical cabinet at Fox Rd Station
- o Replaced generator block heater at Grange Ave station.
- o Replaced bypass pump block heater at Providence Crossing Station.
- Installed new alternator at Old Baptist Station.
- Responded to call from Grange Ave Pump Station high wet well. After investigating we found the air release chamber was completely blocked. The entire unit was disassembled cleaned and reassembled.
 Due to the overall condition of the valves and pipe we ordered a new unit.
- Removed old transformers from cabinet at Providence Crossing as they are no longer necessary with the new soft start system.
- o Called all automatic fault callers to check for proper operation.
- o Had all generators and bypass pumps serviced.
- o Ran Root cutter on Brimfield manholes NW21 to NW17, NW19 to NW17 and NW 17 to ET8A. Found light to medium roots in all runs.
- o Transferred all tools from old crane truck to new crane truck. Removed diesel tank and pump and installed on new truck.
- o Inspected Lateral repair at 11 Buckwalter Rd.
- o Inspected lateral repair at 3795 Stoughton Rd.
