# LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUSINESS MEETING September 15, 2022

Call to Order: Vice-Chair Coless called the hybrid live/virtual meeting to order at 7:08 p.m.

# Pledge of Allegiance

**Protocol for Hybrid Meetings:** Vice-Chair Coless provided an overview of the protocols for public participation for members of the public attending the meeting virtually over Zoom.

#### **Roll Call:**

- a. The following Board members were in attendance: Vice-Chair Coless, Supervisor Darby, Supervisor MacFarland and Supervisor Sorgini. Chairman Neights was absent.
- b. Also in attendance were: E.J. Mentry, Township Manager; Lauren Gallagher and Nicole Feight, Township Solicitor; Ed Slaw, Township Engineer; Mike Mrozinski, Community Development Director; Lt. Bill Hopkins, and Kaitlyn Phan, Student Representative.

#### **Chairman's Comments**

Vice-Chair Coless announced that an executive session was held prior to the meeting on September 15, 2022 to discuss personnel and legal matters.

#### 1) Presentations

- A) Presentation by the Daughters of the American Revolution Constitution Week Proclamation
  - Chris Janczuk, Betsy Parrish, and Bobbi Riley from the Valley Forge Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution gave a brief presentation on their organization and the upcoming Constitution Week.
  - ii) At the conclusion of their presentation, Vice-Chair Coless read a Proclamation of the Board of Supervisors recognizing September 17-23 as Constitution Week.
- B) Student Representative report from Kaitlyn Phan
  - i) Kaitlyn, a junior at Methacton High School, presented news from the various schools in the district.

#### 2) Consent Agenda

- A) **MOTION:** Supervisor Sorgini made a motion to approve the consent agenda items 1(a), 1(b), and 1(c) including moving the meeting minutes of the September 1, 2022, Board of Supervisors business meeting into the record and authorizing an escrow release to Dunkin' Donuts in the amount of \$166,267.41 and an escrow release to Moscariello at Crosskeys in the amount of \$590,981.65. Supervisor MacFarland seconded the motion with the correction of the amount of escrow.
  - i) There was no public comment.
  - ii) The motion passed 4-0.

#### 3) Old Business

A) Consideration of Resolution 2022-24, granting preliminary land development approval of 420 Church Road subdivision

- i) Lauren Gallagher, Township Solicitor, reviewed the resolution granting conditional preliminary land development approval. The resolution has been reviewed thoroughly by staff and has been shared with the developer, who is in agreement with it.
- ii) **MOTION**: Supervisor MacFarland made a motion to approve Resolution 2022-24, granting conditional preliminary land development of 420 Church Road subdivision. Supervisor Sorgini seconded the motion.
- iii) There was no public comment.
- iv) The motion passed 4-0.

# 4) New Business

- A) Consideration of request for waiver of fence standards at 2008 Janet Drive
  - i) Mike Mrozinski, Community Development Director, provided a summary of the fence standards and the waiver request for 2008 Janet Drive. Mr. Fu-An Kang, property owner, was present to answer questions from the Board.
  - ii) **MOTION**: Supervisor MacFarland made a motion to the approve the waiver of fence standards at 2008 Janet Drive. Supervisor Darby seconded the motion.
  - iii) There was no public comment.
  - iv) The motion passed 4-0.

# B) Consideration of purchase of footbridge for MARA complex

- i) E.J. Mentry, Township Manager, presented the request for approval of the footbridge replacement project for the Township-owned portion of the Methacton Audubon Recreation Association (MARA) athletic complex. The project is included in the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan and has been recommended by the Park and Recreation Board. The proposal includes three options for the bridge material: pressure-treated wood, Trex, and galvanized metal grate.
- ii) **MOTION:** Supervisor MacFarland made a motion to approve the purchase of footbridge for the MARA complex, selecting the galvanized metal grate option. Supervisor Sorgini seconded the motion.
- iii) There was no public comment.
- iv) The motion passed 4-0.

# C) Ratification of approval emergency electrical repairs

- i) Mr. Mentry explained the recent storm-related electrical damage to the underground electric cables servicing the Township building and the library. The damages completely knocked out all electricity to both buildings and required immediate emergency repairs, which were completed within less than a week. The work required a contractor with an estimated cost of about \$90,000. A formal resolution of approval will be prepared for the next Board meeting once the invoice is received from the contractor.
- ii) The Board thanked Township staff for their quick actions and thorough communications throughout the entire process.
- iii) **MOTION:** Supervisor Darby made a motion to ratify the approval of emergency electrical repairs. Supervisor Sorgini seconded the motion.
- iv) There was no public comment.
- v) The motion passed 4-0.
- D) Discussion of Accessible Pedestrian System (APS) for Ridge Pike/Parklane Drive Intersection

- i) Mr. Mentry explained the need to upgrade the pedestrian push buttons at the Ridge Pike/Eagleville Rd./Parklane Dr. intersection with a new APS system that provides accommodations for visually impaired pedestrians. Staff has been working on a solution for several months and has determined that the project will need to go out to bid. Staff was also just informed by PennDOT that there may be federal funding available that PennDOT intends to use for pedestrian intersection improvements, and this project may qualify. Chris Elsier, Transportation Engineer from McMahon, discussed the system in more detail.
- ii) The Board directed staff to proceed with preparing bid specs while simultaneously coordinating with PennDOT to determine the fastest solution for this intersection.

# RATIFYING A CONTRACT FOR EMERGENCY WORK AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF INVOICE FOR EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL REPAIRS

WHEREAS, on or about September 6, 2022, electrical power to the Lower Providence Township municipal building was interrupted due to adverse weather conditions, and following investigation in coordination with the electrical utility, PECO, it was determined that the power outage was caused by damage to underground power cables serving the Township building, and it was further determined that repairs to the electrical service facilities were the responsibility of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the electrical outage resulted in failure of the system to provide adequate power to the municipal building, including the police department, jeopardizing the public safety and health of the Township and its residents and requiring the retention of a vendor to repair the system and install replacement equipment as necessary to ensure proper operation of the electrical system serving the municipal building (the "Emergency Work"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 3102 (h) of the Second Class Township Code, 53 P.S. § 68102 (h), the Board of Supervisors ("Board") is empowered to dispense with public bidding requirements for any public work the cost of which exceeds the threshold amount requiring notice to potential bidders and award of a contract to the lowest responsible bidder when such work is necessitated by an emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Board obtained an emergency quotation from a vendor qualified to perform the Emergency Work and retained the vendor to perform the repairs; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost of the Emergency Work exceeded the public bidding threshold, as indicated in the invoice attached hereto from the vendor; and

WHEREAS, the Board by this Resolution desires to ratify the expenditure of funds for the Emergency Work and approve payment to the vendor in the amount specified in the attached invoice.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it **RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors of Lower Providence Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, that the contract for Emergency Work performed in accordance with the attached invoice by Armour & Sons Electric, Inc., is RATIFIED and payment to said contractor in accordance with the attached invoice, in the amount of \$89,694.40, is APPROVED.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER PROVIDENCE, COUNTY OF MONTGOMERY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE, IN LIEU OF CONDEMNATION, OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN LOWER PROVIDENCE TOWNSHIP FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPEN SPACE PRESERVATION WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Township of Lower Providence is a duly organized Township of the Second Class of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Township, in the lawful exercise of its powers, desires to acquire certain real property located within the Township and identified as Montgomery County Tax Map Parcel No. 43-00-14725-00-1 (hereinafter the "Property"), so as to hold and preserve the Property for various purposes for the benefit of the citizens of the Township, and for the advancement, preservation, and protection of the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township is vested with the power of eminent domain whereby the Township is empowered to condemn and appropriate the Property in accordance with the various provisions of the Pennsylvania Eminent Domain Code; and

WHEREAS, the owners of the Property wish to transfer the Property, by deed, in lieu of condemnation of the Property by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township intends to acquire the Property in an amount not to exceed the appraised value of the property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township of Lower Providence, Montgomery County, hereby authorizes the purchase, in lieu of condemnation, of certain real property, identified as Montgomery County Tax Map Parcel No. 43-00-14725-00-1, for a sum not to exceed the appraised value of the Property; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Manager, and all other proper officers of the Township are authorized and directed to execute any and all documents, and to otherwise take any and all steps necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.
