NO ELECTRONIC WASTE

State law prohibits residents from putting covered devices such as televisions, desktop and laptop computers, monitors, keyboard and anything that connects to a computer out for trash collection.

- A.J. Catagnus accepts TVs and monitors for a fee of \$1 per pound, 1299 West James Street, Norristown, PA 19401 (P) 610-277-2727.
- If you need your TV recycled, you can pay a haul-out company like 1-800-GOT-JUNK or 1-800-HAUL-OUT for removal.

Bulk Item Collection

One bulk item per week, collected on second pick up day. Bulk items are household furnishings, tires, bicycles, stoves, microwaves, washers, etc. If you dispose of old carpet/rugs, you must cut them up into 3' or 4' sections and tie with twine for easy handling. Appliances that have freon such as refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners, please call before collection to schedule an appointment. **1-800-432-1616.**



Holiday Collection

If your collection day falls on a holiday it will be skipped until the next collection day. **Holidays:** New Year's Day (January 1), Memorial Day, Independence Day (July 4), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day (December 25). Christmas trees will be collected on Wednesdays after New Years Day. **Please see the Special Holiday Recycling Collection information found under the Zone Map.**

Waste and Recycling Fees

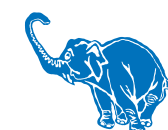
The Township contract requires J. P. Mascaro & Sons to bill each household directly. Households will be billed \$89.37 four (4) times per year. Payment of each bill is due in full upon receipt.

No Hazardous Waste!

Car batteries, gasoline, motor oil, pesticides, oil-base paints and other toxic and hazardous materials do not belong in the trash! Call the Montgomery County Office of Solid Waste Management at **610-278-3000** for information on disposing of these materials or visit www.montgomerycountyrecycles.org. The Township Public Works garage accepts used motor oil and many auto stores collect used car batteries.

Single Stream Recycling is Here!

Lower Providence Township offers a recycling program which makes it easier than ever to recycle.

Cans, Glass, Paper and Plastics can all be commingled in the same recycling toter

64 gallon red toters with blue lids to be used for recycling!

Remember: If you move, the toters should be left behind as they are the property of J.P. Mascaro & Sons.

How do I separate Trash from Recycling?

It's easiest to have a container or two set up where it happens, like a bin in the kitchen for bottles and cans you've washed out, and another in the office for used paper and mail. Just remember that with single stream recycling, it can all go in the same toter – we do the sorting for you.

Single stream recycling will be collected by a compaction truck. Only recyclables will be on this truck on your recycling day, it can not collect non-recyclable items.



WHAT TO RECYCLE?

METAL:

Aluminum cans (beer and soda) aluminum foil and foil plates, etc. Metal lids, Metal food cans (tin/steel).

GLASS:

Glass bottles and jars (food and drink only, any color).

PLASTIC CONTAINERS:

Plastic bottles and containers labeled #1 through #7 (soda, water, milk, juice, liquor, shampoo, detergent, condiments, salad dressing, yogurt, margarine). Plastic shopping bags.

MIX PAPER AND CARDBOARD:

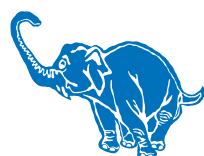
Can be placed loose in the recycle toter. Material such as, newspaper and inserts, magazines and catalogs, junk mail, envelopes, file folders, office white, colored and computer paper (staples and paper clips ok). Corrugated cardboard flatten 2'x 2', boxes, cereal, tissue, gift boxes, etc. (remove liners) paper bags, phone books, wrapping paper (remove metallic paper, bows, etc.)



UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

Ceramics, dishes, coffee cups, drinking glasses, glass oven ware, pyrex, VisionWare, window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, plastics without #1-#7 labeling, plastic bags, styrofoam packaging,

bubble wrap, tissue or paper towels, milk or juice, wax paper, cartons, metallic or coated paper, waxed boxes, books and toys. Food contaminated cardboard (i.e. pizza boxes) and paper towels.



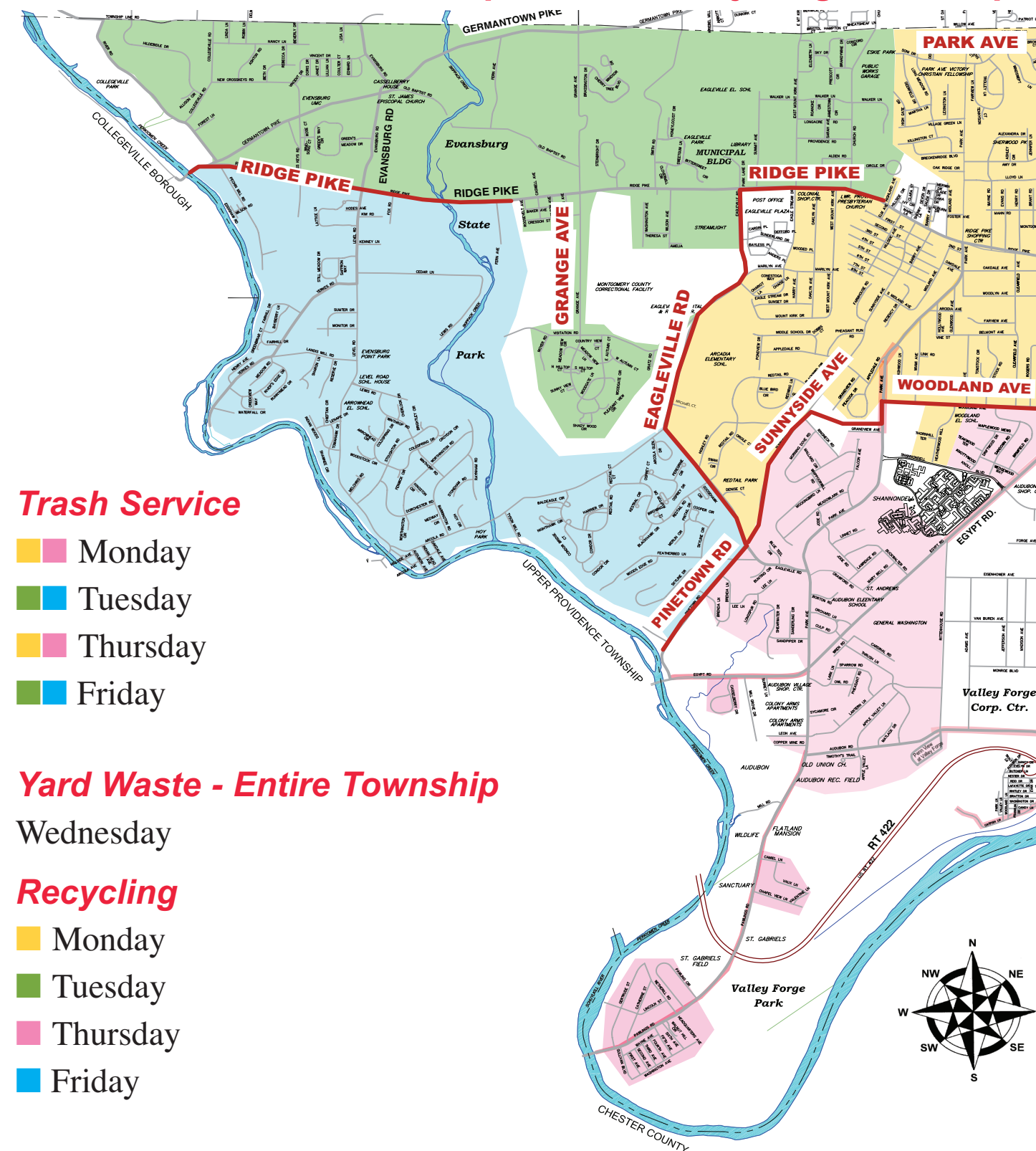
